

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

In the spirit and intent of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's recommendations, Nightwood Theatre acknowledges the land on which our work is created and where our offices are located is the traditional territory of many Nations, including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnabeg, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee, and the Wendat peoples, and is home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples.

We acknowledge them and any other Nations who care for the land (acknowledged and unacknowledged, recorded and unrecorded) as the past, present, and future caretakers of this land, the traditional territory named Tkarón:to, the Mohawk word for "the place in the water where the trees are standing." The treaty for this particular parcel of land (Treaty 13), collectively referred to as the Toronto Purchase, applies to lands east of Brown's Line to Woodbine Avenue and north towards Newmarket.

We recognize the enduring presence of Indigenous peoples on this land. We commit ourselves to addressing and disrupting the systems of oppression and the colonial forces that undermine, distort, or erase the vital role of Indigenous peoples and recognize stewardship as a shared responsibility of all those who reside in a territory, as is the spirit of the Dish With One Spoon Wampum agreement.

PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

This is a story about songs; songs about stories; stories about life. But this is not a show about My Life Story. It's important for me to clarify that because some of the most important people in my life are not mentioned in this story. Some of the most impactful moments of my life are not mentioned here at all. It's really about the songs and where they come from, why they come forth and who they are made for. It is a tribute to the creative process and the healing power of music.



I suppose, in another world, this could have been a proper musical where a fictional character has an

existential crisis and works through it all with a cast of quirky characters. (That's not the worst idea). I could have safely distanced myself from specificities of experience and perspective. But instead, I turned inward, put myself under the microscope and sought a greater understanding of it all. I ended up with a self-compassion project mixed with a performance piece and now they are so intwined, I can't tell them apart.

This show would not exist if it wasn't for the force of nature that is Andrea Donaldson. I would not be having my playwriting debut, if it wasn't for her belief in me to bring this story to life, to dig so deep and expose so much. I wouldn't have turned my psyche into a playground for anyone else but her.

Also, there would be no music in this show without the beautiful people who helped me write and produce these songs over the past twenty years. I would like to thank Karen Kosowski, Jason Gleed, Hill Kourkoutis, Adrian Eccleston and Julia Piker for their guidance and inspiration.

In a show about spirits, I must acknowledge the Army of Ancestors that surround me. I have been blessed with their blood memory, their teachings, their ferocity and audacity to exist and survive despite so many attempts to destroy them. I sing for them and so many others.

Lastly, a massive love gush to all those who have sat in the car with me listening to demos, playing with me in studio and on stage, singing with me, writing with me, and designing cover art for me. I would not be here without you.

Tamara Podemski - Playwright & Performer

Best known for her work on stage and screen, Tamara Podemski starting making music while starring in the Broadway company of RENT. She went on to write two albums in the Anishinaabe language - SPIRIT NATION & SPIRIT VOICES - receiving a nomination for Best Group at the 2002 Aboriginal Music Awards. She released her third album under her own label MUKWA MUSIC, and won Best Female Artist & Best Songwriter at the 2006 Aboriginal Music Awards, as well as Best Music Video at the imagiNATIVE and American Indian Film Festival. Her fourth album was an experimental project called FULL MOON RELEASES, where she produced and released one song - from scratch - every full moon for one year.



Andrea Donaldson - Director

Andrea is Nightwood Theatre's Artistic Director. Prior to her five years as Artistic Director at Nightwood, Andrea ran the company's Write From The Hip program for five years and was the Assistant/Associate Artistic Director at Tarragon Theatre. Awards: Stratford Festival's Jean Gascon Award for Direction, nominations for the Pauline McGibbon & John Hirsch Directing Awards. Her projects have received over a dozen Dora nominations and have been awarded Outstanding Performance (Ensemble) & Outstanding Production for And By the Way, Miss (Theatre Direct).




SHEDDING A SKIN - BY AMANDA WILKIN


