

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

In the spirit and intent of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's recommendations, Nightwood Theatre acknowledges the land on which our work is created and where our offices are located is the traditional territory of many Nations, including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnabeg, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee, and the Wendat peoples, and is home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples.

We acknowledge them and any other Nations who care for the land (acknowledged and unacknowledged, recorded and unrecorded) as the past, present, and future caretakers of this land, the traditional territory named Tkarón:to, the Mohawk word for "the place in the water where the trees are standing." The treaty for this particular parcel of land (Treaty 13), collectively referred to as the Toronto Purchase, applies to lands east of Brown's Line to Woodbine Avenue and north towards Newmarket.

We recognize the enduring presence of Indigenous peoples on this land. We commit ourselves to addressing and disrupting the systems of oppression and the colonial forces that undermine, distort, or erase the vital role of Indigenous peoples and recognize stewardship as a shared responsibility of all those who reside in a territory, as is the spirit of the Dish With One Spoon Wampum agreement.



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I met Chelsea in 2016 when I was brought to Montreal as a guest artist at the National Theatre School to direct her graduating play. Chelsea was then invited into Nightwood Theatre's Write from the Hip program for exceptional emerging artists, which I led prior to stepping into my role as Artistic Director. This play was born out of that process.

In its early days this play was intentionally extremely chaotic. Chelsea was experimenting with how the form could reflect the content of a woman in her mid-twenties in crisis, whose fragments of Vic's mind also represent a multitude. The piece was full of codes and mystery and she left the lines open to being delineated by the creative team and actors. Through our time together, she moved toward a more organized chaos; building a play in which the central character, Vic, responds to six voices in her head, each with distinct drives and representations.

Rehearsing this play can feel like solving a riddle. Chelsea's hyper-detailed, poetic, ensemble-infused text made directing this piece extremely satisfying, albeit an immense challenge. The actors drive this piece at an incredible pace, and I'm so grateful for their attention to detail, perseverance and for the deep trust they have built with each other.

As Artistic Director of Nightwood Theatre, it is so satisfying for this piece to be our inaugural production at our brand new venue — the Nancy & Ed Jackman Performance Centre — that we recently launched with Tapestry Opera in collaboration with St. Clare's Housing. Given that this play peers into a woman's experience seeking safety through the shelter system, it means that much more to be at St. Clare's whose mission is to develop safe, supportive and affordable housing for individuals and families in need.

For two decades, Donaldson has played a pivotal role in fostering new works for the stage, both in her role as Tarragon's Associate Artistic Director and as the program Director for Nightwood Theatre's Write From The Hip program - a unit for exceptional emerging playwrights, in which she developed Rose Napoli's Lo (or Dear Mr. Wells), Grace by Jane Doe, and Every Day She Rose by Andrea Scott and Nick Green. Andrea was invited into The Stratford Festival's Michael Langham Workshop in Classical Direction, and was honoured with Stratford's Jean Gascon Award for Direction. She won the Best Director Award at the International Youth Drama Month in Shenzhen, China for Mistatim, which has played to over 750,000 children internationally. Andrea has been nominated twice each for the Pauline McGibbon Award, the John Hirsch Directing Award and the Gina Wilkinson Award, as well as for several Dora Awards. Andrea received a Dora Award for Outstanding Performance & Outstanding Production for performing in the Urge Collective collaboration And By the Way, Miss (Theatre Direct).

M Fera - Stage Manager (she/her)




